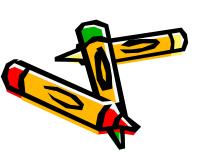
We work towards our rewards each day and at the end of the week we sometimes have a little bit of Golden Time!

writers!








Working in Science

We took part in science week which focused on inventions for the future. In class we made robobugs.






History and Geography

Art





All of our learning is supported by our thinking hats. The "six hats" method as a means of teaching people to view problems from a range of perspectives, and so develop a more rounded way of thinking. We have hats displayed in the classroom.





Reading

 An adult will listen to your child read at least once a week with their home reading books and your child also has guided reading in a group once each week.

- Please ensure your child brings his/her book into school each day (although it is checked on a <u>Friday morning</u>, alongside the reading record). Please try to listen to him/her read each evening and sign the reading record. Ask children questions about the story to ensure they understand what they have read. Also read other texts at homes <u>e.g</u>: recipes, newspapers etc.
- The children also have opportunities to read out loud during lessons, e.g. reading information on the whiteboard, reading out their work to the rest of the class.

We enjoy reading together as a class every afternoon!

Helping your child with Numeracy

- Try to spend some time with your child practising writing the numbers 1-100.
- Practise your multiplication tables- 2,
 5, 10 and 3 timestables
- Number bonds to 10,20,50 and 100
- Adding and subtracting.
 - Using money when you go shopping.
 - D- Telling the time.

RSE

- RSE stands for "relationships and sex education" and as part
 of Relationships and Health Education, is a new approach to teaching
 children about relationships and health. This I now a subject which schools
 must teach. It was taught at St.Marys before now but was not statutory.

We always have fun in year two; when we go out to play and celebrating special events like when we have days like Red Nose Day!






Virtual Dance festival
